- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
- 3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:
- a. disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors have abused the institution's supply chain management system and or committed fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such system.
 - b. cancel a contract awarded to a supplier of goods and services if the supplier committed any corrupt or fraudulent act during the bidding process or the execution of that contract.
- 4 This MBD serves as a certificate of declaration that would be used by institutions to ensure that, when bids are considered, reasonable steps are taken to prevent any form of bid-rigging.

² Bid rigging (or collusive bidding) occurs when businesses, that would otherwise be expected to compete, secretly conspire to raise prices or lower the quality of goods and / or services for purchasers who wish to acquire goods and / or services through a bidding process. Bid rigging is, therefore, an agreement between competitors not to compete.

TERMS OF REFERENCE LAND AUDIT FOR UMNGENI MUNICIPALITY

1. INTRODUCTION OF THE PROJECT:

Umnengi Municipality seeks the services of an experienced service provider for the development and execution of the Umnengi Municipality Land Audit.

2. PROJECT BACKGROUND:

The Municipality has identified the need to undertake a comprehensive land investigation and audit of municipally owned and government-owned properties. In addition to the audit, the Municipality's Fixed Asset Register must be updated and aligned with the valuation roll and the municipal GIS. This alignment is a primary concern and a fundamental prerequisite for effective physical planning and the development of sound planning strategies.

3. AIMS OF THE PROJECT:

The main objectives of the land audit are:

- To add Value the Fixed Asset Register of the Municipality
- To add value to municipal valuation roll
- To enhance revenue collection
- To have a complete and credible cadastral dataset
- To have a clear understanding of the land use status of municipal and government owned properties
- To emphasize the use of land resources and land management in rural areas.
- To verify land ownership
- To identify properties for transfer and registration to Umnengi Municipality

4. SPECIFICATIONS / SCOPE OF WORK

The land audit project seeks to address various issues that compromise the integrity of the Asset Register and, ultimately, strategic and development planning. Accordingly, the land audit aims to respond to key land-related questions and to identify land parcels that are either state-owned or municipally owned.

The land audit will, inter alia, determine the following:

- Which land parcels are municipally owned;
- Which vacant land parcels are state-owned;
- The total number of vacant land parcels;

- Create a user-friendly GIS geo-database with updated data in line with the current attributes reported on the municipality's GIS system – to ensure that the municipality has up to date spatial information to help inform key strategic planning, development, reporting and planning decisions as well as interventions.
- Execute both desktop and ground truth verification of the land audit in a quest to verify and update land activities and that they align with the current database and conform to the Land Use Scheme, Municipal By-Laws and policies so that those found to be in transgression can be prosecuted.
- Conduct the reconciliation between the valuation roll and land audit outcomes.
- Conduct the reconciliation between the fixed asset register and land audit outcomes.
- To determine whether those properties that the municipality disposed of have been properly transferred.

5. DELIVERABLES

The following key deliverables are expected:

- Identification of municipal owned properties in the jurisdiction of the Municipality.
- Identification of all Government owned vacant land (including Health Committee, TLC, Public Works etc.)
- Reconciliation of actual vs permitted usages.
- Imagery of all identified properties included in the study.
- Identification of municipal owned vacant land.
- Registration review of municipal owned vacant land.
- Preparation of valuation reports per property for all Government and Municipal owned vacant land parcels.
- Review of available development options: Disposal, PPP, lease etc.
- Drafting of establishment penalty clauses.
- Stakeholder consultation
- Valuers report for the Municipality.
- A conclusive report.
- Finalisation of recommendations and project close out report.
